**Participate in an AAOS/OOS Sponsored  
Communications Skills Workshop**

Communication skills are necessary in the patient/physician relationship to create mutual understanding and trust. With better communication, improved patient and physician satisfaction, adherence to treatments, better outcomes, and reduced liability have all been reported. Because communication skills can be taught, orthopaedic surgeons should strive to improve these skills throughout our careers. Public opinion surveys conducted by the American Academy of Orthopaedic Surgeons reveal that Americans view us as "high tech, low touch." Therefore, it is important to find new ways to address our communication skills, as part of our continuing medical education.

The Ohio Orthopaedic Society is pleased to offer a Communication Skills Workshop on Thursday afternoon May 13, 2010. It will be presented by two orthopaedic surgeons who were trained at The Institute for Healthcare Communication. This 4.5 hour interactive workshop is based on the Institute's educational model, and modified to reflect an orthopaedic practice. This workshop is appropriate for both Academy Fellows and Residents. It will partially satisfy several competency requirements for MOC, and satisfies one of ACGME competencies for residents

Workshop participants will consider specific communication techniques and discuss orthopaedic specific video vignettes of new patient interviews. Workbooks reinforce the skills that are discussed with the Mentors. The Institute awards up to 4 hours CME credit to each participant.
